We will have a short Zoom business meeting with important information about MAPS plans for the coming year for programs, workshops and exhibits.

Following this Mike Beeman will be doing a live 2.5-3-hour demo via Zoom. He will demo preparing gator board for pastels, doing an underpainting on the prepared board, then the actual pastel painting of a bird. He will also have a short discussion/demo on framing passé partout. Members will be able to ask questions via "chat" during the demo.

“Mike Beeman of Cheyenne, Wyoming, works in pastel and oil, in studio and on location, to paint a variety of subjects, including landscapes, still life and figures. He is a signature member of the American Impressionist Society, Pastel Society of America and a Master Circle artist in the International Association of Pastel Societies. In my mind, artists are destined to be artists. They may not think they are or ever could be, but over time with encouragement I have watched so many individuals become one. The urge to take a class, the support of a friend, the right teacher – these influences on an artist change the person over time and go into each work of art. This is certainly true for me.

When I was a child I loved to color. Throughout school I took art classes favoring black and white media. When I was 23 years old, I asked an astrologer WHEN was I really going to “get into art.” She said it would probably be when I was around 40 to 45 years old. Well...she was right!

At age 43 I took a portrait drawing class with my friend. She really wanted to take a painting class, but I insisted, “I don’t do color.” Each time we passed by the watercolor artists my friend Jayne reiterated that was the class she really wanted to take. We did. I loved it!

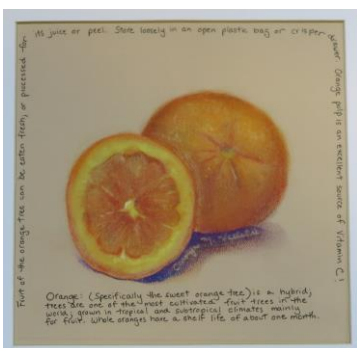
I took another and another class with Shelly Bechtel Shepherd. I learned so much from her! I continued to paint in watercolor and took many other workshops. Another friend Cathy and I painted regularly. I showed my work and won several honorable mentions with Richmond City Art’s Emerging Talent Shows and exhibited with the Hanover Art League. Somewhere along the way I became an artist in my own mind and envisioned having my own show one day.

Meanwhile, in 2008, my friend Dianne wanted me to take a pastel class with her at The Cultural Arts Center - Glen Allen (CACGA). “Why not?” The first night was a disaster, however our teacher, Linda Wolitz, was very patient. Honestly, I almost never went back but did. As time passed, I learned new techniques and continue to do so taking various workshops. Just as I love watercolors, I love pastels. My subjects remain similar with the addition of portraiture.

Finally, my dream of a one-person show came true. In 2011 I told my story at the Cochran Rockville Library in “The Evolving Artist,” Supportive friends enjoyed my story and artist statements of the nearly 30 black and white, watercolor, and pastel artworks displayed.

My art takes note of the beauty in the natural world around us. Most of my creations involve subjects from nature – landscapes, flowers, fruits and vegetables, people, and animals. Some of my paintings, like the Citrus Series, are in-depth studies of the subject. For example, the orange is placed in front of my easel in the studio; another one is

sliced (oh the aroma!) and placed next to it. Through the painting comes a close examination of the features of the fruit inside and out. The beauty in a simple orange appears as I take note.

This careful consideration extends to flowers, people, animals, and landscapes. I prefer to paint the subject from “real life” and the landscapes en plein air. It makes the relationship more immediate and personal for me. My use of color and technique leads to a realistic interpretation of the natural world in all its beauty from the petal on a flower to an expansive landscape.

In 2015 I showcased my works in “Natural Complexions” at the CACGA. I am a Charter Member of the MidAtlantic Pastel Society and exhibit regularly with my two art friends, Jean Kleeman and Terry Atkinson as “Three Friends Painting.”

With the seriousness of everything in our lives this past year, I have discovered new freedoms in artwork – play and joy! I am open to new media and techniques as I continually learn and evolve as an artist. I am thankful to my teachers and my friends for their influence on me. Occasionally someone will ask how long it took to complete a painting and I reply, echoing one of my mentors, “Sixty-six years.”

Award winning painter, instructor and author Tony Allain has been painting for over 40 years. A self-taught painter of colour, light and movement with a complete understanding of his surroundings. Born and raised on Guernsey in the Channel Islands he moved to paint and live in Cornwall, UK to capture the unique clarity of light living on the peninsular of the West Country. Tony has exhibited extensively over the years; his work can be found in many leading galleries as well as private and corporate collections worldwide, including the Maritime Museum, Guernsey and Queen Mary 2, Cunard Ocean Liner. He has exhibited with The Pastel Society of America in New York, the Royal Society of Marine Artists, London, The International Pastel Exhibition, Suzhou, China and the Pastel Society, Mall Galleries, London. A move to New Zealand in 2006 proved to be a turning point in his career with the acceptance as a **Master of the Pastel Artists of New Zealand**. His work is regularly featured in The Artist Magazine, the Pastel Journal and the Practique des Arts. He is a member of **The Pastel Society**, London,UK, the **Master Circle** of the International Association of Pastel Societies, the **Pastel Society of the West Coast**, the **Red Rocks Pastel Society**, the **German Pastel Society**, a Signature member of the **Pastel Society of America**, and an Associate member of **The Royal Society of Marine Artists**, London, UK. "My passion will always be the landscape; it is why I became an artist. I want to share my vision of the world I see. Colour and light is my motivation for choosing a subject. The light sparkling on the water, the colour reflected in the landscape. I favour the early morning or late afternoon to capture these effects. I think an artist has to allow their surroundings to firstly reveal itself in a way that helps them share their vision with others. The quest for perfection can bring with it fear of making mistakes and can result in a style which can seem inhibited. I am not interested in pure representation; my work is about responses to the moods and atmospheres generated by landscape, still life or interior. The most precious thing we artists have is our visual language."
