MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

MELISSA SAULSBURY

I am always asked “Why pastels?” I must admit, it was love at first sight. To this day, when I look at a gorgeous display of open stock colors my eyes grow wide with excitement. The possibilities are endless. The colors are all there. The combinations and marks have the ability to create passion and convey excitement and evoke many different moods. They are impulsive and make a statement. Their ability to evolve and morph the subject with subtle layering is something that only the pastel medium can capture. Because of this, I have spent the last decade perfecting my technique and honing my skills. While I experiment with many different subjects, my favorite remains the Virginia countryside. No matter how far I travel, it always feels like home and this is the feeling I try to capture in my landscapes. Favorite days, happy memories, moments that take your breath away that are preserved through a painting- this is what art is to me.

My current series “Head in the Clouds” prominently features skyscapes. Some of these are a literal interpretation, others are imagined based on harmonious color schemes or a whimsical variation of clouds. Skies seemed a natural choice for me to focus on as a body of work. I can still hear my mother’s voice in my head saying “Melissa, pay attention to where you’re walking” as I gazed up at the clouds. I have always loved their soft edges and many layers and subtle color variations of warm and cool tones. I feel I have been studying them my whole life. This is what I hope to convey to the viewer of this series.

My process is the same regardless of subject. I start with a sanded paper, either Uart, Pastel Premier or Gatorboard primed with clear gesso. My composition is blocked in with Nupastels and washed down with alcohol. After that I proceed to paint dark to light with soft pastels, paying careful attention to shifts in color temperature and edges. My favorite pastels are Terry Ludwig because I like their square shape and the interesting palettes they come in. I also have a lot of Schminke and Unison. I work out of a home studio and paint during the day while my kids are at school. I aim for 2 days a week.
